

## Saturday Morning Pickleball Quadrants

#### SESSION #1



May 1st - June 26th (No Quadrants on Memorial Day Weekend) COST: \$20/session July 10th - August 28th COST: \$20/session

SESSION #2

Each week, you will be assigned to a time/a court. You will play one game to 15 with each person on your court as your partner. You will keep track of the number of points you win in each game. Your weekly winning percentage will be the total number of points you win divided by 45 (the total number of points possible from the 3 games to 15). Those percentages will determine which court you end up on the following week. Each time segment will be 1 hour in length including the warmup. The first group will start at 8:30. The second group will start at 9:30 and so on.

IF for some reason, you cannot play on a Saturday, **YOU are responsible for finding your own sub.** (*Yes, there will be a sub list.*) Your sub cannot move you up a court, but if his/her winning percentage is the lowest on the court that day, the sub can still move you down a court for the following week. IF you don't show up....and don't bother to get a sub on any Saturday, you will automatically be moved down one court the following week. It's not fair to the other 3 players who are waiting for their "fourth" to have no game that day.

**SIGN UP INFORMATION:** You can sign up as a **regular**, where you are going to play each week. You can sign up as a **sub** and play when someone needs a sub, OR you can sign up with a friend and **"share" a spot**. When you share a spot, one of you will play in your "spot" each week. **Please shoot Ann Turner (anna\_b\_turner@yahoo.com) an email if you would like to sign up for Session #1.** Once we get things organized, Mike Gramaglia and Hildy Bonhaus have graciously offered to be the point people for the weekly emails/court assignments. Feel free to ask Ann any questions about the Pickleball Quadrants! **PLEASE sign up by April 17th so we can get things organzied. THANKS!!**
