Work completed since January report

- Completion of kitchen rough plumbing – work continues to make connections in service bathrooms.
- Rough carpentry completed
- Epoxy injected in leaks in basement walls
- New door opening cut and bricks reinstalled
- New floor installed in kitchen, back stairways and basement halls and pub kitchen
- Electric rough in has begun
- Removal of shrubs from area of new dock and garbage area
- Demolition of exterior kitchen concrete stairs begun
- Defined plans for new garbage area and concrete pad including new concrete walk that does not drain.
- All dishes, glass wear and flat wear have been inventoried to begin process to increase inventory to 300 of each consistent with our stated capacity of 270

Work to be completed next four weeks

- Rough electric completed
- New windows and door installed
- Complete electric and plumbing connections
- Drywall repairs and install new PVC Trusscore waterproof panels on interior walls
- Paint two exterior kitchen walls
- Install dropped ceiling with LED panel lights
- Remodel ladies service bathroom and new floors installed in both men's and lady's service bathrooms
- Begin work on new garbage area and dock.

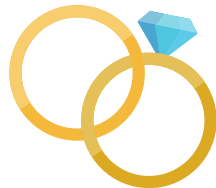
