




Kitchen Reno Update

The kitchen floor covered what appeared to be an old courtyard foundation which required several days of jackhammer work. We are a week behind original schedule but had three weeks of extra time at end of schedule so unless we discover more surprises we should complete work before the first rental in April. See the list below for a list of tasks that were completed in January.

- Remediation of asbestos in tile and adhesive in kitchen and down stairs hallway.
- Demolition of the kitchen interior walls and ceiling as well as the lower bar lower cabinets.
- Removal of abandoned heating pipes, radiators and conduit.
- Saw cutting the concrete floor and removal of 12 yards of concrete, dirt and rubble in preparation to install the new waste plumbing under the floor.
- Installation of new waste sewer pipes, gravel and concrete to restore the kitchen floor.



Annual Meeting Recap

The Lyceum 2022 Annual meeting was held on January 24 in a combined virtual and live format. A full-length video of both parts will be available via a link that will be posted on the Lyceum website.

The Director's reports showed that 2021 was a big recovery year following 2020. Social activities returned to normal during the year. The Directors Ball was a great success with its Roaring 20s theme. The total kitchen renovation project began late in the year. Revenues were up as wedding rentals were back at the Lyceum. We had a small net profit in 2021 and our investment portfolio performed well.

Two issues were voted on by the membership as part of the meeting. A proposal for revisions to the Constitution did not pass. A proposal for Phase 2 funding for the Kitchen Renovation passed.

Finally, a big thank you to Susan Swaine, Bill Skyllingstad and Heather Geary for all their contributions as Board members over the past three years. A big welcome to new board members Jenny Wheeler and Alicia Peterson and returning board member Heather Geary who were elected during the meeting.




